The Career Preparedness course focuses on three integrated areas of instruction–academic planning and career development, financial literacy, and technology. Course content ranges from college and career preparation to computer literacy skills to ways to manage personal finances and reduce personal risk. The area of technology is designed to be interwoven throughout course instruction. Mastery of the content standards provides a strong foundation for student acquisition of the skills, attitudes, and knowledge that enables them to achieve success in school, at work, and across the lifespan. This course may be taught as two one-half credit courses consisting of Career Preparedness A and Career Preparedness B. Career Preparedness A will be taught in Grade 8 and Career Preparedness B in Grade 12.
